A VIBRANT PRE-NURSERY-GRADE 8 SCHOOL WITH A CLOSE-KNIT COMMUNITY

East Woods School is a non-sectarian day school for boys and girls from Pre-Nursery through Grade 8. Nestled on a picturesque 46-acre campus on the North Shore of Long Island—just 30 miles east of New York City—East Woods offers a dynamic and nurturing environment where students thrive academically, socially, and personally.

The school is distinguished by its palpable energy and spirit. Students take pride in their achievements, supported by an environment that balances tradition with innovation, and emphasizes kindness, respect, and intellectual curiosity. At East Woods, individuality is celebrated, creativity is encouraged, and every child is truly known. The result is a community of thoughtful, articulate, and passionate young leaders ready to make a difference.

Families are drawn to East Woods because of its warm, supportive culture and its deep commitment to character development. They value the school's mission, its dedicated teachers, and the welcoming atmosphere that fosters both academic excellence and personal growth.

With a Pre-Nursery through Grade 8 structure, East Woods provides an intimate learning environment where students develop the confidence, skills, and resilience to transition seamlessly into high school and beyond.

At East Woods, teachers do more than educate—they inspire, mentor, and shape young minds. They cultivate curiosity, build confidence, and instill lifelong values. The bonds formed here extend well beyond the classroom, creating lasting relationships. Founded in 1946, East Woods received its first accreditation from NYSAIS in 1971 and remains a proud member of both NAIS and NYSAIS. Today, the school is thriving, well-positioned for continued growth, and presents an exciting leadership opportunity for its next Head of School.



Vision

East Woods School will fulfill its mission and deliver a superior academic program with a focus on character education to assist its students in becoming successful, happy, and intelligent learners. Students will continue to gain knowledge, skills, and confidence to solve problems and become caring, responsible community members. Graduates will emerge from East Woods prepared to be contributing citizens and compassionate leaders in a complex and changing world.

This will be accomplished through a renewed commitment to student-centered, experiential, and holistic learning fostered by a highly motivated faculty within a nurturing community. Teachers will engage students in a challenging, stimulating, and progressive interdisciplinary curriculum with a focus on written and verbal communication, supported by the integration of technology. Teachers and students together will cultivate a love of learning in an independent school environment characterized by freedom and flexibility.

Philosophy

East Woods seeks to install a lifelong love of learning and an appreciation of self-worth. In an intimate Pre-Nursery through Grade 8 setting, enhanced by a low student-teacher ratio, a supportive and caring faculty encourages each student to meet challenges and to pursue personal excellence in all endeavors. Academic, creative, and physical activities are designed to broaden children's understanding of everyday life and to prepare them for the future. The development of respect and concern for all people and the world we share is intrinsic in the curriculum at all levels.

East Woods encourages each student to meet or surpass academic and behavioral expectations defined by the faculty. Our comprehensive course of study and superior staff enables students, through active involvement, to develop the essential skills of reading, writing, speaking, listening, and thinking in all the disciplines. Family participation is an integral part of the East Woods experience, with parents, students, and school working together to develop the full potential of each child.



HISTORY

East Woods School was founded in 1946 in Cold Spring Harbor by a group of dedicated parents committed to creating an exceptional educational environment. Originally located in the West Hills section, the school embarked on its journey to provide a nurturing and rigorous academic experience.

In 1948, East Woods moved to its current location in Oyster Bay Cove, settling on a property known as "Baywood." Designed by renowned architect William W. Bosworth, the expansive 46-acre campus became the perfect setting for the school's growing educational community.

In 1951, the State of New York granted East Woods School its charter, officially recognizing it as an accredited institution. This milestone marked a significant step in the school's development and solidified its standing within the state's academic community. Over the years, the campus expanded with the addition of a dining hall, gymnasium, athletic locker rooms, classrooms, and an art studio.

Subsequent growth led to further enhancements, including a library expansion, the construction of a preschool wing, a dedicated music center, and a second gymnasium. In 2009, as enrollment grew to 280 students, East Woods further expanded its facilities, adding a separate Upper School academic building, a new science center, and an enlarged art studio—ensuring the school remained well-equipped to support its students' academic and creative pursuits.










A SMALL SCHOOL BY DESIGN







The Lower School, Grades K-4, focuses on developing foundational skills in reading, writing, math, science, social studies, world languages, history, physical education, and the arts (music, performing, and studio), with technology integrated throughout. Spanish is introduced as the first world language, and students receive individualized attention from faculty while enjoying numerous opportunities for public speaking and performing throughout the year. East Woods aims to foster a love of learning and supports the development of the whole child in an academically rigorous yet nurturing environment







In the Upper School, Grades 5-8, students engage in a well-rounded, hands-on curriculum that spans science, technology, math, languages, history, literature, athletics, and the arts. Eighth graders take great pride in their responsibility as leaders of the school. They run the student government, organize the social functions of the school, and are active participants and leaders in various community service projects. This leadership role provides students with a sense of poise and confidence.

The secondary school placement list for East Woods School is very impressive. East Woods graduates attend the most highly respected day schools in the area and a significant number of graduates are enrolled at the most prestigious boarding schools in the country.

East Woods School offers academic advancement for students performing above grade level in reading for Grades K-4 and math for Grades K-8. Extra help is provided through the Learning Center. GOVERNANCE

The East Woods Board of Trustees is committed to its function as the school's governing body. Interview Base

The Board of Trustees of East Woods School is conducting an international search to identify its next Head of School. Search consultants Carole Everett and Deirdre Ling of Educators Collaborative solicited input from all stakeholders during an on-campus visit, and gathered additional input from stakeholders through an online survey. Based on this information, impressions of the consultants, and feedback from the Head of School Search Committee, the following represents a summary of the school's strengths, challenges, and opportunities, and the skills and attributes desired in the next Head of School of East Woods School.

Strengths of East Woods School

- East Woods School has a strong sense of community characterized by a culture of positivity and warmth. Each constituent confirmed the family-like feeling of the school environment.
- EWS prides itself on shaping good citizens grounded in mutual respect and places a great emphasis on being nurturing and compassionate. Individuality is encouraged.
- A beautiful campus in an idyllic setting enhances the learning experiences.
- Small class sizes are taught by dedicated faculty who enable students to forge deep and meaningful relationships with their teachers. "At East Woods every child is known."
- The curriculum is notable for its differentiation, for offering academic advancement and support, especially through the Learning Center.
- The academic program is highly regarded within the EWS community and the greater educational community. EWS's high school placement record is impressive, both with boarding and day schools.
- The arts are strongly supported and include both visual and performing arts for students throughout the grades.
- Parent engagement and volunteerism is strong and families regularly express their satisfaction with the school's programs and culture.







- The faculty, administration, and staff are hardworking, giving countless hours for the good of the school.
- The faculty, many of whom are long-tenured, are devoted to the mission and provide outstanding learning opportunities for each student.

Characteristics of the Next Head of School


East Woods School seeks a leader who enthusiastically embraces and champions the school's mission, values, and philosophy.

EWS seeks a visionary leader and passionate educator to step into the challenging role of Head of School. An individual who brings energy, integrity, and intellect will thrive and experience success in East Woods School community.

The ideal candidate will possess many of the following skills and attributes:

The Search Schedule

The Search Committee plans to identify a preliminary group of candidates to interview in April 2025. From this group, the Search Committee will select finalists for interviews on campus in early May 2025. The Trustees expect to reach a decision and appoint a Head-Elect shortly after finalist visits in early June 2025. The term of office is to commence on July 1, 2026, allowing for an extended transition phase.
