### **PURPOSE**

### Independence

### **Exploration Inspired**

Vermont Academy faculty believe that the value of learning and knowledge cannot be fully realized if confined to the traditional classroom alone. VA cultivates a learning culture where students' individuality and ingenuity, the land, and the community liberate learning and knowledge for life. Through specialized curriculum and course offerings, VA is able to provide something that interests all students.

### **Growth Oriented**

In every area of their education, VA meets students where they are as learners and members of the community and help them set a compelling trajectory toward achievement. With the MAPS (My Action Plan for Success) program, VA empowers students to set their own goals and coaches them as they work to reach them. Teachers focus on identifying and cultivating talent and creativity, fostering growth, and emphasizing the importance of the journey as well as the destination. VA's college counseling team works one-on-one with students to help them find a college that targets their best interests and abilities.

### CENTER FOR LEARNING

At the Center for Learning (CFL), teachers meet students where they are academically and work closely with them to develop effective skills and strategies for their needs and challenges. Through a partnership with VA's caring, dedicated, and knowledgeable staff, students develop self-awareness, learning about their strengths and using those to overcome their challenges. In this way, VA helps students become independent learners and develop skills they will use throughout their lives.

### **COLLEGE COUNSELING**

The Vermont Academy College Counseling Office strives to help VA students find the colleges that match their abilities and interests and where they can be successful. From the moment students join VA's tight-knit community, counselors work closely with each student to determine the right balance of academic challenge and extracurricular activity to serve them well on the road ahead. Finding the right college fit is an important journey in self-awareness and one that asks VA students to seek direction. VA is committed to providing each student with the expertise, guidelines, and resources to make that process run both smoothly and effectively.



### **TECHNOLOGY**

The Technology Department at Vermont Academy supports the technology of the entire campus and provides wireless internet access to all buildings using a network of about 75 wireless access points. As well, academic buildings have public multi-function printers/copiers/scanners available for student use.

The Technology Department provides support to faculty and students from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the week and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to noon. Internet access times for students run from 6 a.m. to 10:45 p.m. during the week, except during study time. Seniors and PGs are afforded 24-hour internet access.

VA is a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) school and all students are allowed to connect three (3) devices to the Vermont Academy network. We support mainly Windows-based and Mac-based computers.

### MAPS - MY ACTION PLAN FOR SUCCESS

MAPS is our trademarked methodology of helping students understand how they work and learn best, how to identify and build on their strengths, and how to develop personal strategies for reaching goals.

MAPS plans are working documents developed by each student with feedback and support from his or her advisor, teachers, coaches, and parents. The document encompasses several areas, including student self-assessments of strengths and weaknesses, learning preferences, and goal setting with action steps for success.

Students' main partner on their MAPS journey is their advisor. One of the advisor's key roles is to guide the student to discover, understand, and make decisions regarding his or her learning and development opportunities in the curriculum and community. Students meet with their advisor 2-3 times per week. Each advisory period has an assigned topic or curriculum organized by the Coordinator of the MAPS Program that the advisor follows, ensuring that all students receive the same information and guidance in a more personal manner and environment.

### **ATHLETICS**

Vermont Academy's athletic program promotes development of the whole student athlete—head, hand, and heart—by focusing on teamwork and sportsmanship, self-discipline, and an appreciation of lifelong fitness.

#### Wildcat Nation

At VA, athletics are much more than an extracurricular activity. They are a fully integrated part of the Wildcat experience, providing opportunities for leadership, learning and personal growth for student athletes of all ability levels and interests.


Vermont Academy offers a competitive and engaging athletic and recreational program for student athletes looking to progress in their sport. As a member of the New England Preparatory School Athletic Conference (NEPSAC) and the Lakes Region League, the Wildcats compete in 14 varsity sports, such as hockey, basketball, and soccer, with more than 70% of students earning at least one varsity letter each year.

Outside of the regular soccer season, in addition to participating on other VA athletics teams, VA student athletes have the opportunity to play for LaLiga Grassroots and be coached by LaLiga coaches. LaLiga Grassroots is a global initiative by LaLiga, the professional league in Spain, to support, promote, and bolster grassroots football around the world.



### VA at Mount Snow

Due to our proximity to Mount Snow Ski Resort we've been able to bring VA student athletes world class snowboard and ski development programs with Vermont Academy at Mount Snow.

Vermont Academy at Mount Snow offers a unique opportunity for student-athletes to cultivate their passion for on-snow sports while maintaining a consistent college preparatory program. Athletes can elect to train four sessions per week at Mount Snow or board at the Matterhorn campus for a more immersive experience. Teachers and coaches work collaboratively to support goal-driven student-athletes while instilling confidence, perseverance, and independence. This exceptional combination of elite coaching and strong academic programming sets VA students on the path to athletic and academic success—without sacrificing one for the other. Vermont Academy at Mount Snow acts as a winter boarding school which allows student athletes to stay in dorms near the slopes so they can hone their skills while maintaining their studies in a one-on-one tutoring environment. VA's winter sports boarding school is equipped for intensive full-day training sessions to unlock the true potential of VA student athletes.





### **ARTS**

From the physics whiz who discovers a talent for graphic design, to the varsity basketball player who gets on stage for the 24 Hour Play festival, to the robotics team member who plays drums in the jazz ensemble, every student at Vermont Academy has the opportunity to get involved in the arts.

### **Performing Arts**

The Vermont Academy Performing Arts Department strives to make the performing arts accessible to all, empowering students to become creative collaborators in hopes of enriching the community at large.

Throughout their time at VA, students can learn to sing in the Vocal Ensemble, pick up an instrument, or two, or three, in a private lesson or in the Chamber and/or Jazz Ensembles, be a part of the spring musical, choreograph and perform a dance routine, become a theater tech wizard, write and perform their own songs, and so much more. By having numerous opportunities within the music, theater, and dance programs, many of VA's students transform into seasoned performers, writers, directors, and technicians by their senior year.

### **Visual Arts**

The Visual Arts department at Vermont Academy works with a wide variety of mediums, which include drawing, painting, collage, pottery, woodworking, and media arts including filmmaking and photography.

Each Visual Arts course combines an understanding of art skills and concepts along with students' personal creativity. VA hopes to cultivate visual literacy through its classes, its art displays, guest artists, and field trips/weekend trips. Students are always encouraged to bring their own personal style to their work while VA teaches them essential lessons that relate to the technical level of the class.

The arts faculty at VA, who are working artists themselves, encourage students to enter juried competitions such as the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards. Each spring, courtesy of the Bob '37 and Beth Campbell Endowment Fund for the Arts and Lecture Series, all seniors are invited to participate in a competition to have their art be purchased by Vermont Academy for the school's permanent collection.

### THE VA COMMUNITY

The VA community is center to everything we do at Vermont Academy and makes VA a place like no other. By providing a small and supportive community, students feel known and are encouraged to grow and discover their voice. The lessons imparted in the classroom and dorms, on the fields and stage, provide students with an education for life.

### **Residential Life**

Vermont Academy is a coed boarding school with a strong residential program that fosters community and prepares students for independent living. The dormitories serve as homes away from home, creating micro-communities where students build relationships with peers and supportive dorm parents. Beyond the dorms, the school provides various facilities like the Wildcat Den and Student Lounge for relaxation and socializing. Additionally, Vermont Academy offers a winter-term ski academy at Mount Snow, combining academic programming with professional skiing training

### **International Students**

Vermont Academy welcomes international students from over 20 countries, aiming to create a sense of belonging for them. To support their transition, the international team provides extra care and resources to help students adapt to their new environment. New international students have the opportunity to arrive early to ease cultural shock and adjust more comfortably. During international orientation, student leaders, proctors, and faculty work together to ensure that all students feel comfortable and happy in their new home.









### **DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION AT VA**

Vermont Academy's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Committee is comprised of dedicated faculty, staff, and students who aspire to create an environment in which all people—regardless of gender, marital status, sexual orientation, political orientation, ideology, physical disability, ethnicity, economic level, age, or religion—can feel comfortable and thrive.

In 2014 Mitchell Thomashow wrote in *The Nine Elements of a Sustainable Campus*, "Rapid global environmental change is a contemporary reality, whether it affects the campus through climate change, through loss of biodiversity, through environmental pollution, through the provision of energy and food, or through the effects of a superstorm. The campus has a moral obligation to raise community awareness about these issues because they will ultimately affect the lives of all of its students."

This is at the core of VA's Sustainability Program, which is woven into our everyday lives due to our location in Vermont, a state known for its natural beauty, progressive views on community, social justice, and environmental conservation. VA's Sustainability Program and Environmental Club are rooted in these local values while also maintaining a global perspective on issues surrounding humankind and our relationship with the natural world.
